They Had To

Rules from Leviticus—Keep all my decrees and all my laws and follow them. I am the Lord. (19:37)

About grain offerings—

Season grain offerings with salt. (2:13)

About fellowship offerings—

Splash the blood against the sides of the altar. (3:2)

About sin offerings—

Remove both kidneys with fat on them near the loins. (4: 9)

About burnt offerings—

The fire must be kept burning on the altar continuously; it must not go out. (6:13)

About eating—

Anyone who eats blood must be cut off from their people. (7:27)

These are the birds you are to regard as unclean and not eat because they are unclean: the eagle, the vulture, the black vulture, the red kite, any kind of black kite, any kind of raven, the horned owl, the screech owl, the gull, any kind of hawk, the little owl, the cormorant, the great owl, the white owl, the desert owl, the osprey, the stork, any kind of heron, the hoopoe, and the bat. (11:13-19)

About diseases—

A man who has lost his hair and is bald is clean. If he has lost his hair from the front of the scalp and has a bald forehead, he is clean. But if he has a reddish-white sore on his bald head or forehead, it is a defiling skin disease, the man is diseased and is unclean. (13:40-42)

About mold—

To purify the house, he is to take two birds and some cedar wood, scarlet yarn and hyssop. He shall kill one of the birds over fresh water in a clay pot. Then he is to take the cedar wood, the hyssop, the scarlet yarn and the live bird, dip them in the blood of the dead bird and the fresh water, and sprinkle the house seven times. (13:49-51)

About clothing—

Do not wear clothing woven of two kinds of material. (19:19)

About the aged—

Stand up in the presence of the aged. (19:32)
